Example Statements	In 2013, 46.9% of Hispanic female high school students in the U.S. had ever had sexual intercourse.	In 2013, 43.3% of female high school students in Kentucky had ever had sexual intercourse.	In 2013, 10.4% of middle school students in Chicago had ever had sexual intercourse.	State: In 2012, 74.0% of states assisted districts or schools by developing, revising, or assisting in the development of model policies, policy guidance, or other materials for HIV prevention education.  District: In 2012, 82.2% of districts had adopted a policy stating that high schools will teach HIV prevention.  School: In 2006, 88.4% of high schools required the teaching of HIV prevention.	In 2012, 96.6% of the secondary schools in Arkansas had teachers that taught how to prevent HIV, other STDs, and pregnancy in a required course in any of grades 9, 10, 11, or 12.
